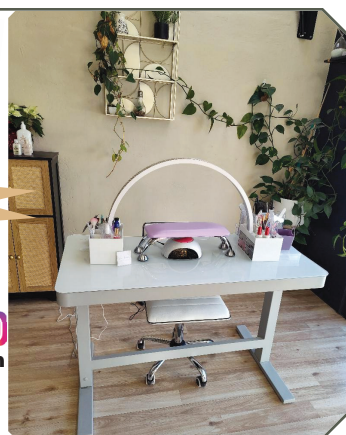

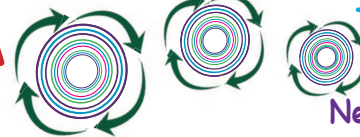

Shaniko Water Tower

It was in the summer of 2024 I met David Coe. He had family history questions. He had a photo of a Shaniko school class and as I was having a yard sale, he wondered about the water tower.

As I live right next door to it, I told him he could go look at the building. He recognized it as the one the school class was standing in front of. I was thrilled, as that had to be the first or near first class year in the town. I told Mr. Coe the first building used for the subscription class of 1900 was held in a small shed across the road and west in the intersection from where the school is now. The new Water tower, "Tank House" as he titled it, was an amazing sight to this historian.

David Coe's mother was a student in this 1900 scene. He listed his older two generations having been associated with Arlington (Great grandparents) and Grandparents in Shaniko.



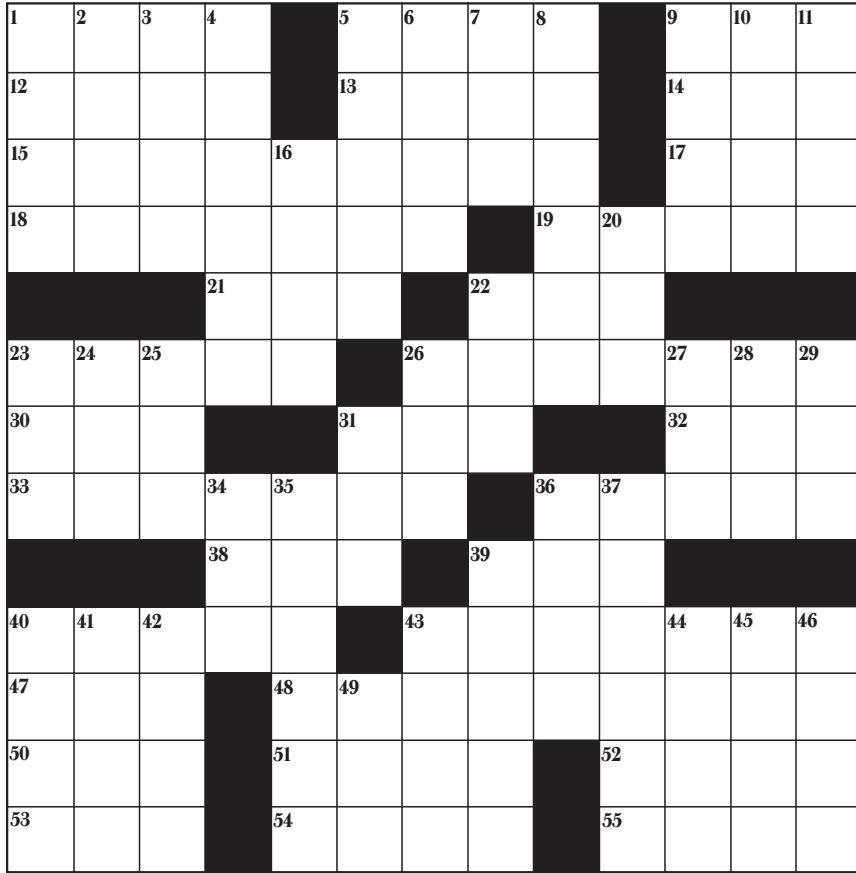
1900 Water Tower with school class

chap. Out of it, I picked up an acupuncturist and a place where you can get a tarp repaired.

The downside of my dependency on the dog park is that people who are not dog owners think I'm slightly mad.

"That's a beautiful painting," said a friend the other day in my living room as he stared at a lush green landscape by Australian painter Remnim Alexander Tayco. "How did you come across the artist?"

Or when asked how I found my accountant, I reply, "I met her at the dog park."

At this pint, people crinkle their noses, as if to say, "What a peculiar place to find an accountant." But, what would be a better place? The local grocer? A 10-pin bowling alley?

At least I'm confident my accountant, as the loyal owner of an even-tempered Pug, is unlikely to suddenly disappear with all my money.
