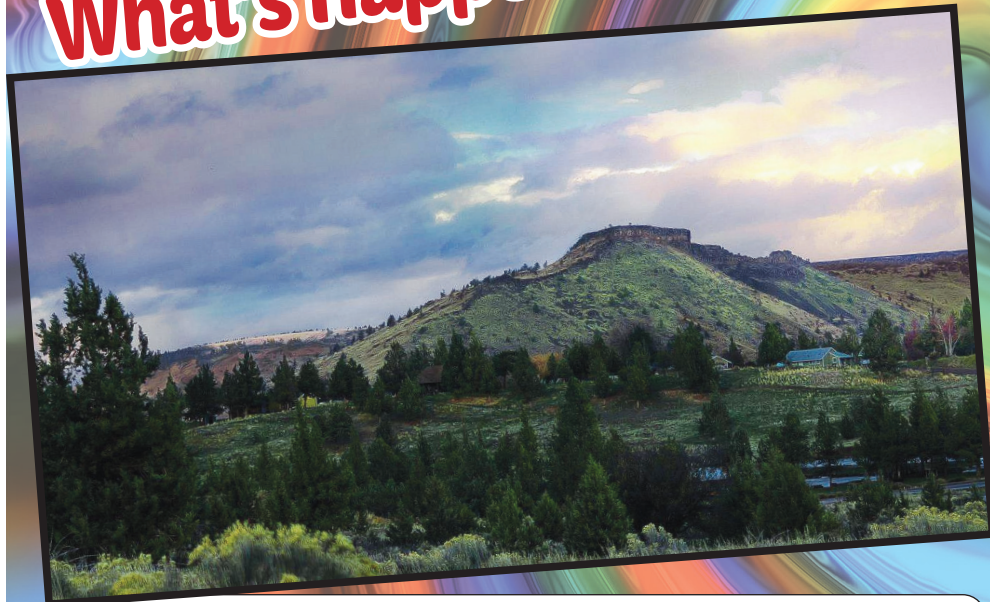

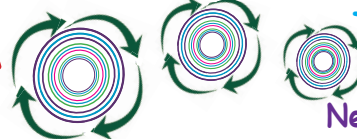

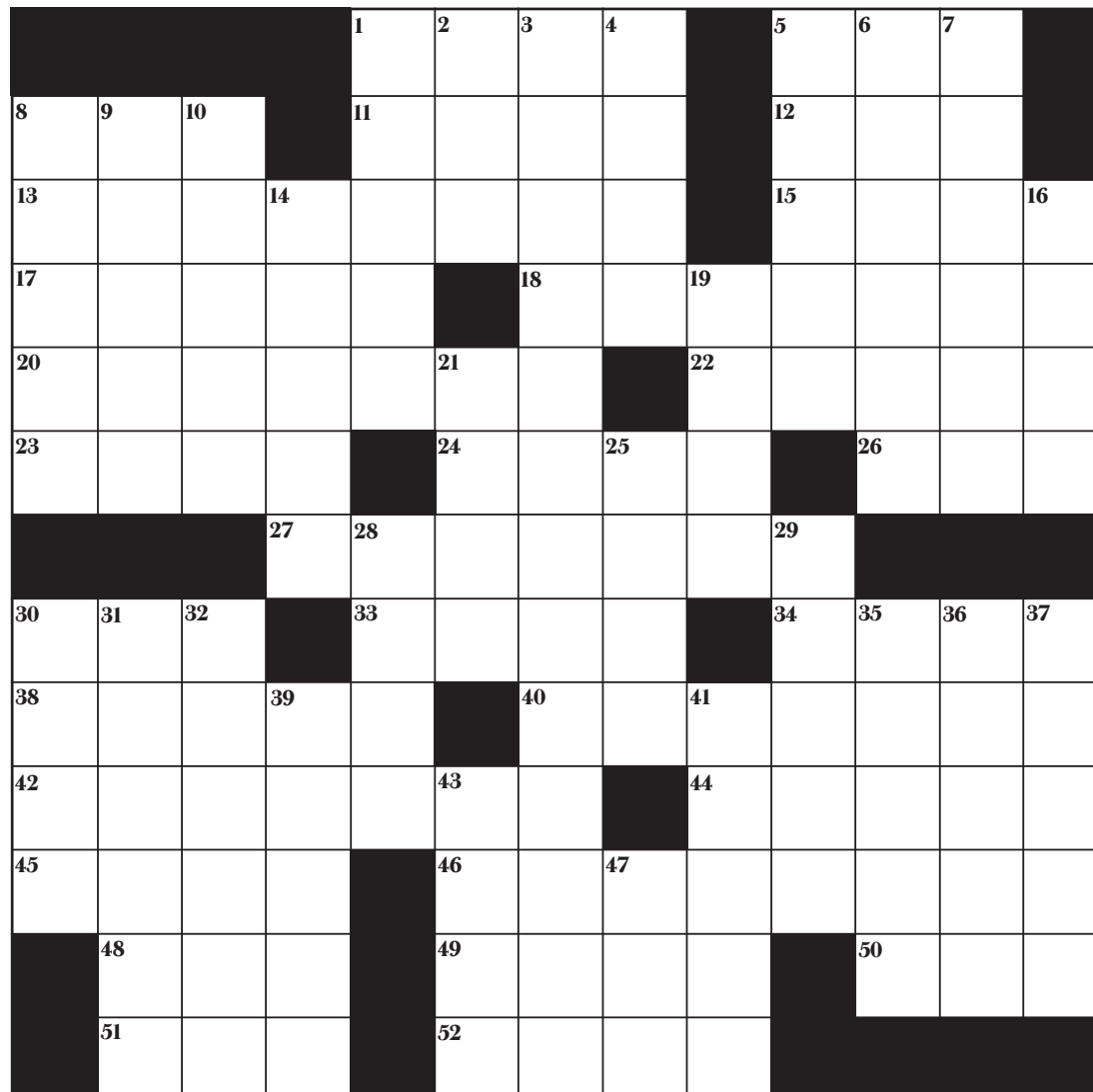

It's A Medical Miracle! Men Don't Need Doctors!

Why, oh why, is it so difficult to get rope bucking, struggling men to see their doctors? Wives, daughters and sisters wish to know!

A typical scenario in my house generally plays out as follows....

"Oh, is it?" Cursory glance in the mirror. "Yeah, I guess so."

"Yes," he said, perplexed. "Everybody knows that."

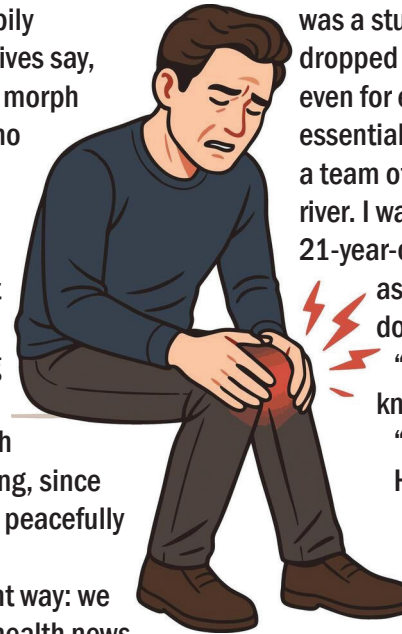
"Why don't they?" she asked.

Oregon's Ghost Towns

Ghost towns in Oregon fall into two categories; mining and agricultural. If economic trends and profitable location were in its favor, the late

1800 and turn of the century towns continued to grow into the present day. If not, they began dissolving over the decades, ravaged by time, weather, critters, and vandals.

A revival of interest in the relics of former times began taking place in the 1940's and 50's. Not all of the interest was in preservation. Tax laws prompted some owners to tear old building down. Arson and looting, along with "treasure" hunters proved devastating

to the habitations of yesteryear.

The late 60's and 70's brought an intense interest in preserving and restoring old towns. Museums began filling up like never before with artifacts and photographs of our not so recent past. New ones were built or old structures were renovated to house the resurfacing curiosities of the bygone days.

As time marches on, not everything can or is being salvaged, but former times can be appreciated by what has been and is being written and preserved today.
